A pretty presentation isn't going to save you from doing the work



Don't start with slides, start with an outline

Telling a good story is just like running a good meeting

Set an agenda

- Outline what your going to say
- Give them an idea of how long it'll be
- Tell them when they can ask questions

What answers you need (if you have open questions)






Set context

Where you are in the project



Key moments Key activities Important meetings


Important findings and discoveries



Evidence


Who what you learned

- Show what you did at each step
- What you did with those learnings



Remind them

If you have a lot of evidence someone might forget the key moment you just mentioned



Wrap up Recap what you just talked about What your doing next When your talking to them next

Empathize with the audience Take your time covering complex things Anticipate their questions so they aren't confused Imagine they haven't been their throughout the process



) How you tell the story

Your role is to inform the audience not to pitch to them

Review your outline and look at what should be **emphasized**

Use the most direct play to communicate each point of your outline

Photo, diagram, a big statement on the slide

Complex things might take several slides

Deck visuals 101

Simple is better One font; 3 styles max Pick an icon set you like and stick to it

Slide types Title slide Picture slide Picture and text slide Statement slide 3 items slide

Duplicate slides to keep styles in sync

In the future Don't start from scratch, duplicate a deck and tweak as needed
